The pieces (located under Attachments at right)

- Stamp cover: Title pages for the display; print one sheet per page.
- Stamp Part 1: The first 10 pages of stamps; print one or two sheets per page. (If you print two sheets per page, make sure to print in landscape.)
- Stamp Part 2: The remaining 9 pages of stamps; print one or two sheets per page. (If you print two sheets per page, make sure to print in landscape.)

How to assemble

- Print the three PDFs (located under "Attachments" at right).
- Optional: Cut apart the individual stamps.
- Affix the stamp images and title pages to the wall/display.
