

School district hires two administrators

The Florence 1 Board of Trustees approved the hiring of two school administrators: Carrie Brigman as assistant principal at Williams Middle School, and Eric Robinson as principal at Wilson High School at its regular meeting on May 10.

Brigman currently serves as the mathematics coach at North Vista Elementary School, where she has worked for the past six years. She received a bachelor of science degree in elementary education from Francis Marion University in May of 2003, and a master of education degree from the University of Tennessee at Martin in December of 2006. Brigman previously taught math at JV Martin Junior High School in Dillon.

Eric Robinson will replace Dr. Gerard Edwards, who has been reassigned to the Florence 1 Alternative School. He is a 1990 graduate of South Florence High School. He received

a bachelor of science degree in biology from the University of South Carolina (USC) in August of 1995. He also holds a master of education in administration from USC. He is currently pursuing a doctorate in education leadership from the University of Phoenix.

Since 2002, Robinson has been serving as principal of Hampton Elementary School in Hampton. His prior experiences include serving as the assistant principal at Gray-Court Owings School in Laurens (2001-2002); science teacher and coach (football, basketball, and track) at North District Middle School (1998-2002); Hampton; 8th grade science teacher at Williams Middle School (1997-1998); and 7th grade science teacher at North District Middle School (1995-1997).
