DIY Botanical Prints Supplies List

Station 1:

- Free botanical prints found online, including prints from *The Magnolia Journal* Spring 2017 issue. These were printed on 11" x 17" paper, resulting in a print that is 9" x 12".
- Paper cutters
- Scissors

Station 2:

- Miter boxes and hand saws Pencils
- 36" long dowel balsa wood dowel rods; each participant received one dowel rod, which made four 9"
 cuts.
- Rulers or measuring tape

Station 3:

• Fine grit sandpaper cut into squares

Station 4:

- Wood stain (library staff likely has some in their basement or garage)
- Newspaper or tablecloths to protect the table
- Paintbrushes
- Bowls or cups of water
- Paper towels
- Post Its
- Pens
- Plastic gloves
- Snacks! We set out bags of chip, clementines, brownies and bottled water

Station 5:

- Staple gun loaded with 1/4" staples
- Staple remover (for mistakes)
- Scissors

Station 6:

- Staple gun loaded with 1/4" staples
- Twine
- Scissors

Other supplies: snacks of your choosing, a flat head screwdriver to open the cans of stain and a mallet to seal them back up.
