Instructions: Each round will consist of 3 questions. Questions will get progressively harder as the rounds go on, which means they will also be worth more points. After the question is asked, you will have approximately one minute to answer and bring your answers to the table. There is no reward for being the first, so there is no rush. We want this to be a fair game, so please do not use phones or shout out the answers. If we see you using your phone, your team is disqualified for that question. There will be a break after round 3 and round 6 for you to get up, stretch, use the bathroom, etc, but if you need to get up before then, please wait until the question has been answered to return to your seat. Don't forget to tip your servers and bartenders!

Round 1 (5 points each)

- 1. Book: Who is the author of *The Da Vinci Code*?
 - a. Answer: Dan Brown
- 2. Music: What band is known for their album "Nevermind" and the hit song "Smells Like Teen Spirit"?
 - a. Answer: Nirvana
- 3. Movie: What film, directed by James Cameron, was the first motion picture to reach the \$1 billion dollar mark with a worldwide gross of \$1.84 billion dollars at the box office.
 - a. Answer: Titanic

Round 2 (5 points each)

- 4. Book: Born in the District, and raised in Oxon Hill, this author of Ghost and Long Way Down.
 - a. Answer: Jason Reynolds
- 5. Music: Indie rock band Veruca Salt take their name from which classic book by Roald Dahl?
 - a. Answer: Charlie and the Chocolate Factory
- 6. Movie: The television show Stranger Things has renewed the popularity of this artist, whose songs include 1978's Wuthering Heights.
 - a. Answer: Kate Bush

Round 3 (5 points each)

- 7. Book: What is the title of Harper Lee's classic novel?
 - a. Answer: To Kill a Mockingbird
- 8. Music: Which artist released the album "American Idiot"?
 - a. Answer: Green Day
- 9. Movie: What was the first James Bond movie ever made?
 - a. Answers: Dr. No

Round 4 (10 points)

- 10. Book: What is the full name of the main character in Suzanne Collins' *The Hunger Games* trilogy?
 - a. Answer: Katniss Everdeen
- 11. Music: Whitney Houston sand "I Will Always Love You" for "The Bodyguard's" soundtrack. Which country icon originally sang this song?
 - a. Answer: Dolly Parton
- 12. Movie: What is the name of the fictional place where Frozen takes place?
 - a. Answer: Arendelle

Lightning Round: You have until the end of this song to list all 12 major Greek Olympians and bring them to the table. You will receive 1 point per God/Goddess.

b. Answer:

- Zeus (god of the skies, considered king of the gods),
- Hera (goddess of marriage, queen of the goddesses),
- Poseidon (god of the seas and brother to Zeus),
- Demeter (goddess of agriculture, presiding over fertility of the earth),
- Athena (goddess of wisdom and knowledge),
- Apollo (god of healing, medicine, music, and poetry),
- Artemis (goddess of hunting and wild animals, and chastity),
- Ares (god of war),
- Hephaestus (god of fire, blacksmithing and metalworking),
- Aphrodite (goddess of love, beauty, pleasure, relationships),
- Hermes (god of travel—sports, trade and mischief),
- and either Hestia (goddess of hearth and home, though she never married) or Dionysus (god of wine, two pronunciations, also subject of a popular KPop song).

Round 5 (10 points)

- 13. Book: This book is named after the temperature in which paper burns. Bonus Point if you can also name the author.
 - a. Answer: Fahrenheit 451 by Ray Bradbury
- 14. Music: What is the name of Adele's debut album?
 - a. Answer: 19
- 15. Movie: What are the five student stereotypes in Breakfast Club? 2 points per stereotype.
 - a. Answer: A brain, a beauty, a jock, a rebel, and a recluse.

Round 6 (10 points each)

- 16. Book: What is the name of the vampire family in Stephenie Meyer's *Twilight* series?
 - a. Answer: The Cullens

- 17. Music: Which band member famously left One Direction?
 - a. Answer: Zayn Malik
- 18. Movie: Which holiday do Meg Ryan and Billy Crystal celebrate at the end of When Harry Met Sally?
 - a. Answer: New Year's Eve

Round 7 (10 points each)

- 19. Book: What was Stephen King's first novel, and when was it published?
 - a. Answer: Carrie in 1974
- 20. Music: What is the stage name for the artist whose real name is Katheryn Elizabeth Hudson?
 - a. Answer: Katy Perry
- 21. Movie (Multiple Choice): How many Pixar animated films have been released? 18, 21, 26, or 33?
 - a. Answer: 26

Round 8 (15 points each)

- 22. Book: Who is the author of *A Song of Ice and Fire* series, which has been adapted into an HBO series?
 - a. George R.R. Martin
- 23. Music: What book do The Police reference in the song "Don't Stand So Close to Me?" 5 bonus points if you can give both book and author.
 - a. Answer: Lolita by Vladimir Nabokov.
- 24. Movie: What was the first animated movie to be nominated for Best Picture at the Oscars?
 - a. Answers: Beauty and the Beast

BREAK: Tally points and read out how many points. Ask teams to write down how many points they have on their answer sheets.

FINAL QUESTION: The category is: famous first lines. Based on this category, please wager how many points you would like. Think of this like final jeopardy. If you get the answer right, you get that number of points. If you get it wrong, you lose that many points. (Give them 2 minutes to wager)

- What classic novel starts with the sentence, "It was a bright, cold day in April and the clocks were striking thirteen?"
 - Answer: 1984 by George Orwell (only need the title not the author)
